You are invited to apply for an exciting new job at Link Health and Community.

About the job

The Bicultural Community Workers will work with the Rohingya community in Springvale to design a project. The project will support Rohingya people to connect with other communities, make friends, learn and teach skills for fun or to make money. Also, to explore roles in the community and support adjusting to life in Australia.

There are two jobs available. Each job is for about 8-10 hours per week for 6 months. The office is in Mulgrave, but you will also work in Springvale and Dandenong locations.
